Remembering the good times. With hope that What is Past is Prologue


Oooops – last month I missed a good one from 1996. Here it is:


Fredericksburg Student exchange group was also here during this time. Chaperones were Cathy Bolinger and Charlie Sieracki



Salade Niçoise

This salad was inspired by a classic with many variations. The one offered here today is a compliment by Judy Hansen – one of her favorites:

Line a large platter with Lettuce (I like Butter lettuce, but your choice) Arrange servings of the following around the platter:

- Canned Tuna (I like Albacore, packed in water)
- Potatoes, cooked until firm and sliced 1/4", marinated briefly in French dressing
- French-style green beans (cooked or canned), marinated as potatoes
- Tomatoes sliced, also marinated briefly

Garnish with black olives, sliced hard-boiled eggs, rolled anchovies

Sprinkle lightly with mixture of olive oil, wine vinegar, capers, and herbs (basil, oregano)

Suggested Pairing from your editor: For an elegant evening on the patio, why not pull out all the stops and enjoy a festive rosé Champagne with this classic salad. Champagne's deceptively high acidity will contrast with the richness of the tuna while standing up to the dressing's vinegary tang.
